INTRODUCTION:

The work of salvation contains six basic issues that will be developed in some detail throughout this study:

- 1) IT ORIGINATES IN THE MIND OF GOD. cf. Romans 8:29-30; Ephesians 1:4-6
- 2) IT DEPENDS UPON THE GRACE OF GOD (129 times in New Testament). cf. Ephesians 2:4-10; II Timothy 1:9-10; Titus 2:11
- 3) IT REQUIRES THE MINISTRY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. cf. John 1:12-13; 3:1-8; Titus 3:5; I Peter 1:23-25
- 4) IT CENTERS IN THE DEATH AND RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST. cf. Romans 3:21-26; 4:25; 5:8-11; I Corinthians 15:1-4; I Peter 1:3, 18-21
- 5) IT DEMANDS A HUMAN RESPONSE.

THE SACRAMENT CATHOLIC SALVATION

Council of Trent (1545 - 1563 a.d.) Vatican I (October, 1962 - December, 1965)

THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS:

- BAPTISM
- CONFIRMATION
- PENANCE
- EXTREME UNCTION
- HOLY ORDERS
- MARRIAGE
- EUCHARIST/ MASS

On March 3, 1547, the Council of Trent defined the nature of the sacraments:

"If any one saith, that the sacraments of the New Law are not necessary unto salvation, but superfluous; and that without them, or without the desire thereof, men obtain of God, through faith alone grace of justification; though all are not necessary for every individual; let him be anathema!"

In Canon V, the Council said:

"If any one saith, that these sacraments were instituted for the sake of nourishing faith alone: let him be anathema!"

In Canon VI, the Council said:

"If any one saith, that the sacraments of the New Law do not contain the grace which they signify; or, that they do not confer that grace on those who do not place an obstacle thereunto as though they were merely outward signs, of grace or justice received through faith, let him be anathema!"

- 1B. CALLED 295 times in NT; Greek verb used 147 times
 - 1C. It is an INVITATION to all people Matthew 22:1-14; Romans 10:13; Revelation 22:17
 - 2C. It is the INITIATION of God Himself Acts 2:39; Romans 8:29-30; Jude 1
- 2B. CHOSEN (elected) to select out of (for oneself) Matthew 22:14; Ephesians 1:4 used 49 times in NT: Greek words used 45 times
- 3B. PREDESTINATED to mark out a boundary beforehand (English "horizon") Romans 8:29; Ephesians 1:5; Greek verb used 6 times (Acts 4:28; Romans 8:29-30; Ephesians 1:5, 11

2A. THE MOMENT WHEN THESE DECISIONS OCCUR

Ephesians 1:4 - "before the foundation of the world" I Corinthians 2:7 - "before the world (ages)" Romans 8:29 - "who he did foreknow"

Note: Predestination is based on God's foreknowledge!

3A. THE MOTIVES BEHIND THESE DIVINE ACTS

- 1B. God's PLEASURE He simply wanted to do it!

4A. THE MANNER IN WHICH THESE DOCTRINES COINCIDE WITH HUMAN RESPONSIBILITY

Greek (charis) - used 156 times in NT; (charizomai - 23 times; charin - 8 times)

 - 1B. The SCOPE of His grace "full of grace" cf. Luke 2:40 "the grace of God was upon Him"
 - 2B. The SUPPLY of His grace "grace for grace" (charin anti charitos)

- 1B. In the CASE of Jesus Christ Matthew 4:1-11
 - 1C. Satisfaction of physical needs
 - 2C. Presumption and testing God
 - 3C. Acquiring worldly possessions and position
- 2B. In the CONTENT of I John 2:15-17
 - 1C. LUST of the flesh the desire to have what does not belong to you or the desire to commit sin against God's holy and righteous standards.(50 times - various English words; 53 times - various Greek forms of the word)
 - Note: Lust is a sin Romans 7:7-8; 13:9; I John 3:4 Lust is a desire that arises from our own sinful nature Mark 7:21-23; Romans 1:24; 13:14; Ephesians 2:3; 4:22
 - 2C. LUST of the eyes the desire to have things you see that do not belong to you or you should not have. cf. Job 31:1; Matthew 5:28
 - 3C. PRIDE of life boasting/confidence/security in your occupation/career/means of livelihood cf. I Timothy 6:6-10

3A. THE STEPS TO VICTORY

- 1B. You must ACKNOWLEDGE sin in your life!
 - 1C. As to NATURE Romans 3:20; I John 3:4

 - 3C. As to RESULTS Romans 6:23; James 1:13-15
- 2B. You must ACCEPT the death of Jesus Christ as your only payment for sin and the gift of forgiveness!
 - 1C. It was SATISFACTORY as to the righteous demands of the law II Corinthians 5:21; Hebrews 7:26-27; 9:22
 - 2C. It was SUFFICIENT as to His ability and the amount of sin to be paid for I John 2:2
 - 3C. It was SUBSTITUTIONARY only for those who believe it Matthew 20:28; Hebrews 9:28; 10:14; I John 1:9
- 3B. You must AVOID the temptation to ignore, justify, or hide your sin!
 - 1C. REALIZE that you cannot hide from God Psalm 139:1-6; Hebrews 4:13
 - 2C. RECOGNIZE that the blessing of God cannot be upon your life and service Psalm 66:18; Proverbs 28:9; Matthew 5:23-24
 - 3C. REFUSE to hide or cover up your sin Proverbs 28:13
- 4B. You must APPLY the principles of God's Word in order to have freedom from guilt and deliverance from sinful practices! cf. Psalm 119:9, 11; Romans 6:16; Galatians 5:16-26

THE PLAN OF REDEMPTION Romans 3:21-28

WORDS USED:

English word "redeem" appears 56 times in the Bible, only twice in the NT; "redemption" appears 20 times in the Bible, of which 11 times are found in the NT; "redeemed" appears 62 times in the Bible, with only 7 references in the NT; "purchased" appears 9 times with 4 NT references; "purchase" is found 8 times with one NT usage.

THREE KEY WORDS IN GREEK:

- (1) *lutroo* 3 times (Luke 24:21; Titus 2:14; I Peter 1:18 ("to loose")
- (2) exagorazo 4 times (Gal. 3:13; 4:5; Eph. 5:16; Colossians. 4:5) ("to buy out of")
- (3) apolutrosis 10 times (Luke 21:28; Romans 3:24; 8:23; I Cor. 1:30; Eph. 1:7, 14; 4:30; Colossians 1:14; Heb. 9:15; 11:35) ("to loose from")

2A. THE UNIQUE CHARACTER OF OUR REDEMPTION

1B. RANSOM - a price that is paid to redeem us cf. Matthew 20:28; Mark 10:45; I Timothy 2:6 English word used 13 times; only 3 times in NT Greek word, *lutron*, used 2 times; antilutron once

- 2B. PASSOVER SACRIFICE a sacrifice which protects from judgment cf. I Corinthians 5:7 and Exodus 12:1-28; English word "Passover" appears 76 times in Bible; 28 times in NT.
- 3B. PROPITIATION a satisfaction (mercy-seat) of God's wrath against sin cf. Romans 3:25; 1 John 2:2; 4:10 Greek word *hilasmos* used twice; *hilasterion* twice (including Hebrews 9:5 "mercy seat")
- 4B. RECONCILIATION a restoration back to a previous condition that existed before the fall of man the relationship between God and man is changed cf. Romans 5:10-11; II Corinthians 5:18-20; Ephesians 2:16; Col. 1:20-21 (English word in its various forms appears 12 times; Greek words, *katallasso* and *katallage* appear 10 times)
- 5B. SIN-OFFERING a sacrifice which bears the sin of the offerer used 118 times in the Bible cf. Psalm 40:6-8 with Hebrews 10:5-12
- 6B. SWEET-SAVOR OFFERING a sacrifice that is pleasing to God used 43 times in the Bible cf. Genesis 8:20-21; II Corinthians 2:14-17; Ephesians 5:2
- 7B. ATONEMENT a covering for sin used 81 times in English Bible, but only once in the NT Romans 5:11, where the Greek word for reconciliation appears. Hebrew word, *kaphar* appears 104 times in OT (13 times in Leviticus 16).

"VICARIOUS ATONEMENT" - substitutionary - a sacrifice which is made in substitution for the sinner and satisfies the demands of the law against the sin - cf. Isaiah 53:6; Matthew 20:28; II Corinthians 5:21; I Peter 3:18

THE PRIORITY OF REGENERATION John 3:1-8

USAGE OF WORDS: "regeneration" - English - used twice (Matthew 19;28; Titus 3;5); "born again" - used 3 times (John 3:3, 7; I Peter 2:23); English word "born" used 49 times, 14 of which refer to regeneration; Greek Verb *gennao* used 98 times (cf. I John 2;29; 3:9; 4:7; 5:1, 4, 18)

1A. THE CHARACTERISTICS OF REGENERATION

- 1B. It is a real birth equal to physical birth -John 3:3-6
- 2B. It is a work of God beyond the realm of human recognition John 3:8
- 3B. It is an instantaneous work, not a process ("born again" aorist tense) cf. I Peter 1:23 "being born again" perfect passive participle
- 4B. It is a work of God that results in a new nature or creation II Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 2:10; 4:24; II Peter 1:4

2A. THE CRUSES OF REGENERATION

- 1B. Born of God John 1:12-13
- 2B. Born of the Spirit John 3:8.
- 3B. Born through the Word I Peter 1:23-25

3A. THE CONSEQUENCES OF REGENERATION

- 1B. FAITH THAT JESUS CHRIST IS THE MESSIAH I John 5:1
- 2B. LOVE FOR GOD AND OTHERS John 8:42; I John 3:14; 4:7-8; 5:1
- 3B. RIGHTEOUSNESS I John 2:29
- 4B. GOOD WORKS Ephesians 2:10

THE PLACE OF REPENTRNCE II Corinthians 7:9-11

O.T. USAGE:

NACHAM - 40 times as "repent" (to lament; grieve) - nearly always used of God Himself *SHUBH* - 3 times as "repent"; 185 times as "turn"; 369 times as "turn again"

N.T. USAGE:

METAMELOMAI - feeling of concern or regret - used 8 times *METANOEO* - to change the mind and/or conduct - 60 times

1A. WHAT IS REPENTANCE?

The word "repent" is used 22 times in the OT and 24 times in the NT in the King James Version of the Bible. The word "repented" appears 17 times in the OT and 15 times in the NT, and the word "repentance" appears once in OT (Hosea 13:14) and 25 times in the NT.

- 1B. It is a change of mind.
 - 1C. Away from sin Hebrews 6:1 (*apo* from dead works)
 - 2C. Toward God Acts 20:21 (eis)
- 2B. It is not merely feeling sorry that you sinned or got caught.
 - 1C. Example of Judas Matthew 27:3
 - 2C. Example of Esau Hebrews 12:15-17
- 3B. It is described as a gift of God Acts 5:31; 11: 18; II Timothy 2:25
- 4B. It is a "godly sorrow" for sin that results in positive action. cf. II Corinthians 7:11 (involves seven things)
 - 1C. CAREFULNESS Greek word, *spoude*, refers to speed or eagerness with which a person responds when confronted.
 - No. 1 YOU RESPOND AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO THE SITUATION!

- 2C. CLEARING OF YOURSELVES Greek word, *apologia*, means "defense" or "apologetic" it is an apology rooted in the desire to be forgiven for what you have done.
 - No. 2 YOU REACT WITH A SINCERE APOLOGY AND SEEK THEIR FORGIVENESS!
- 3C. INDIGNATION Greek word, *aganaktesis*, appears only here in the NT. Some believe that it indicates the "pain" which one feels because of what sin has caused.
 - No. 3 YOU REALIZE THE PAIN YOU HAVE CAUSED TO OTHERS!
- 4C. FEAR Greek word, *phobos*, suggests the attitude toward God, but in particular, fear of consequences.
 - No. 4 YOU REMEMBER THE CONSEQUENCES OF CONTINUING IN THIS SIN!
- 5C. VEHEMENT DESIRE Greek word, *epipothesis*, used 4 times in NT, all of which are found in II Cor. 7. I t emphasizes the conviction which the Holy Spirit has placed upon one's heart.
 - No. 5 YOU RECOGNIZE THAT THIS IS A PRIORITY IN YOUR LIFE!
- 6C. ZEAL Greek word, *zelos*, is a common word to indicate the effort and desire to stop the sinful behavior and to live a godly life.
 - No. 6 YOU RESOLVE TO SETTLE THIS MATTER IN WHATEVER WAYS POSSIBLE!

7C. REVENGE - Greek word, *ekdikesis*, appears 9 times in NT. In Luke 18:7-8 it refers to God Who will "avenge" His own elect. It refers to the "days of vengeance" in Luke 21:22. Moses "defended" and "avenged" a fellow Israelite by killing an Egyptian says Acts 7:24. We are told in Romans 12:19 not to "avenge" ourselves. Vengeance belongs to God alone. The word refers to God's vengeance on unbelievers at the second coming of Jesus Christ (II Thess. 1:8). It refers to the punishment of evildoers by those in authority in 1 Peter 2:14. There is a judgment side of the word and a defense side of the word. The likely intention is that when true repentance has occurred, there is a willing acceptance of the judgment of God, and the consequences of disgrace, humiliation, and loss on the part of the one who has repented, and no effort to defend, justify, or excuse sinful behavior.

No. 7 - YOU RESTORE WHATEVER IS POSSIBLE TO SETTLE THE MATTER AND TO ACCEPT THE CONSEQUENCES OF YOUR SIN!

2A. WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN FAITH AND REPENTANCE?

- 1B. When mentioned together, repentance is always mentioned first Matthew 21:32; Mark 1:15; Hebrews 6:1
- 2B. Repentance must precede faith you cannot express confidence in God's Word until your mind is changed.
- 3B. Repentance results from the preaching of the Word Matthew 12:41; Acts 2:36-38

THE PRINCIPLE OF CONFESSION I John 1:5-2:2

USAGE OF WORDS:

HOMOLOGEO - 26 times, 10 in John's writings (cf. Matthew 10:32; John 1:20; 9:22; Romans 10:9; I John 1:9; 4:2-3, 15)

HOMOLOGIR - 6 times (cf. I Timothy 6:12, 13; Hebrews 3:1; 10:23)

EHOMOLOGEO - 10 times

(cf. Mark 1:5; Acts 19:18; Romans 14:11; Philippians 2:11; Revelation 3:5)

LXX (Septuagint) - means "to praise God" or "to confess sins"

Used in legal matters (agreements/ contracts/ court proceedings) referring to witnessing to the truth and/or admission of guilt. Used of making a promised or giving an oath - cf. Matthew 14:7 (*homologeo*) and Luke 22:6 of Judas (*exomologeo*).

Josephus said, "Confession of sin preserves one from God's judgment."

exomologeo - used 120 times in LXX - primarily to refer praise and thanks to God - cf. Psalm 107:1, 8, 15, 21, 31

We glorify God when we admit He is right and we are wrong!

HAGIOSUNE (feminine noun - holiness; sanctity) - used 3 times

HAGNEIA (feminine noun - purity; chastity) - used 2 times in I Timothy 4:12 and 5:2

HAGNISMOS (masculine noun - consecration; purification) - used once in Acts 21:26

HAGNIZO (verb - to purify; make clean) - used 7 times

HAGNOS (adjective - chaste; pure; perfect; holy) - used 8 times
